INTERNATIONAL TRANSPORT LAW

Entrepreneurs who conduct their business activity in the field of road transport beyond the country's borders should familiarize themselves with binding Conventions.

Please remember that with the applicable Polish legal system, the texts hereafter do not constitute a source of law, and are purely for informative and reference purposes.

- **CMR Convention** – Contract for the International Carriage of Goods by Road governing the duties of the contracting Parties (the sender, the consignee and the carrier).
- **AETR Convention** – European agreement concerning the work of crews of vehicles engaged in international road transport.
- **TIR Convention** – Convention on international customs system governing the international transport of goods under cover of TIR Carnets. The Convention simplifies the proceedings at the border-crossing points and at the customs offices in order to increase the effectiveness of road transport.
- **Vienna Convention** – international treaty establishing standard traffic rules
- **ATP Convention** – Agreement on the International Carriage of Perishable Foodstuffs and on the Special Equipment to be Used for such Carriage.
